Due to the current sheltering-in-place order, and the financial implication that institutions of higher education are facing across the State, PBCOHE has made the decision to cancel the 50th Annual Conference which was to occur June 7-9, 2020 in Pittsburgh at Station Square. PBCOHE will provide a full refund of all conference registration cost upon written request by May 31, 2020. If you wish, your registration can be rolled over to the 2021 Annual Conference.

It is important to note that our current online payment system is not set up to reverse charges for registration fees paid by credit card. You will receive your refund in the form of a check. In addition, PBCOHE is extending annual membership for all current members and those with full and one-day conference registrations for the 2020 conference until 2021.
